In 1979, a group of Perry County artists and art enthusiasts gathered to form sustainable creative programming for the Perry County community that included a series of classical music concerts (Sunday Arts Hour) and a platform for young musicians to compete (The Talented Young People's Contest, known today as Youth Art Day). Perry County Council of the Arts officially gained nonprofit status on September 19, 1982 when the state accepted our Articles of Incorporation. This year, PCCA celebrates its 40th year anniversary!
