
Tyler Shenk joined PCCA in May 2022 and is responsible for scanning PCCA's physical archives for electronic storage.



BEHIND THE SCENES

with Ben LaDieu, Best-In-Show winner in the Annual Juried Exhibition



One of the main influences that has shaped a lot of my work is the writer H.P. Lovecraft. I just finished reading his anthology, and the stories he tells really inspire me to world build. I can get lost in his atmosphere of alternate realities that are just beyond the cusp of our own reality. His descriptions of these worlds captivate me. As far as

visual artists, I really love Junji Ito's horror comics. I'm not even really a manga guy, but his work speaks to me. In terms of an audio atmosphere, I envision my work accompanied by dub-techno or ambient music by Celer.

Over the years I have really taken to pen and ink. At first I just used rapidograph pens but found the cleaning of them to be a pain. I bought my first dip pens and Japanese inks and had some real challenges with the medium. Especially in the beginning, I really struggled. Recently, I



have become more comfortable with the dip pen. I also enjoy pencils too; I just have to remember to keep them sharpened!

As an emotional and introverted person, I tend to keep to myself reflecting on life, philosophy, geopolitics, how the world works, as well as my own ideas and issues. My Fantastical Roots series and pencil landscapes are my latest works and contain more emotional elements. During their creation, I explored deeper within myself and projected those feelings and life frustrations onto the surface. No one can truly understand what I am going through with my emotions and that is ok, as it is quite a personal journey. You get a glimpse of it through my artwork.

For my most recent work, Navrilloth, I feel particularly good with how I handled my pen strokes, the composition and learning how to navigate foreground and background.




I really like how this upturned tree emerges from the ground in its monsterous shape. This one was different than other roots I had found in that it formed a kind of cave and had moss growing over the top of it. When I saw this in the forest, I knew immediately I would draw it. Again, my interest in the horror and monsters of the woods was motivation for the piece. It was almost living and I think I captured that.
