West Perry High School Hosts Theater Arts Artist

ELLIOTTSBURG – West Perry High School is excited to announce an artist residency with Abigail Leffler, Education Director of Bloomsburg Theatre Ensemble. The residency will occur once a week for ten weeks from February through early April 2024. Ms. Leffler is working with Nathan Grippin, English teacher and Drama Club Adviser to offer students increased theater skills in performance, improvisation, stage technical skills and voice and movement.

While some of the students have roles in the upcoming Sponge Bob musical, March 7-9, the skills are helpful for any student. Students will develop increased confidence in how they present themselves and in how they respond to situations in their lives.

The residency is supported by Pennsylvania Council on the Arts (PCA) funding through the Arts in Education program. Perry County Council of the Arts (PCCA) is the local partner who arranges and oversees the residencies. The school district and West Perry Theatrical Boosters Association, Inc. are also supporters.
