#### **Danville Head Start Pre-K Host Music Program**

DANVILLE –Danville Head Start Pre-K has enjoyed hosting Mary Knysh, founder of Rhythmic Connections, for an artist residency in drumming and music. The residency began in the fall of 2023 and will continue until June. Children have made their own drums and use them for a wide variety of brain-based rhythmic activities that include work on steady beat, linking language to rhythm, drumming as storytelling, creative music and movement. Children also hear a variety of musical styles and learn to listen and dance to them.

Ms. Knysh travels nationally and internationally with her creative body of work which focuses on advancing education, health, and creative development through rhythm, movement, drum circles, and music improvisation. The residency is supported by Pennsylvania Council on the Arts (PCA) funding through the Artist in Education program. Perry County Council of the Arts (PCCA) is the local partner who arranges and oversees the residency. Funding was also provided by The Exchange in Bloomsburg and the Community Giving Foundation: Danville.

### About the artist

Mary E Knysh is the founder of Rhythmic Connections, an innovative company advancing education, health, and creative development through drum circles and music improvisation. An international teacher/trainer with the Music for People organization, Mary is also an Orff Schulwerk clinician, professional musician and international teaching artist. She is endorsed by Rhythm Band Instruments and Remo corporations. Mary travels throughout the United States and internationally offering conference presentations, clinics, teacher-trainings, performances and workshops.
